# Rainy Day Walks & Activities

# Walks

## Askham & Helton fell:

Great for dogs/kids who love splashing in big puddles (it is a favourite of the Hartsop Fold labradors!). What3Words for start/parking: ///choice.directive.mentions follow the footpath heading uphill/northwards (it eventually gets to Heughscar Hill where there is a great view of Ullswater). It's a great place to spend some time and you can make the walk as long and short as you like. Finish by heading to Lowther Castle Café a short drive away (dog friendly).



## Walk to Patterdale and/or Glenridding

Patterdale is our lovely local village with a fantastic dog friendly pub. You can walk there using two low level routes. Our favourite route is heading out of the North end of the park and past the waterfall. But you can also head out of the south end of the park and pick up a footpath near Cow Bridge. You can continue onto Glenridding which is a popular village and has more places to eat and shop.

### **Lowther Estate Trails:**

Lowther has lots of lovely walks and trails through the estate. You can tie it in with a visit to the café and gardens too. Park at the castle carpark for the café and gardens or at Low Sawmill carpark for the trails.

### **Keswick - Threlkeld Railway Trail:**

Accessible 10km (5km each way) route. Keswick has lots of dog and kid friendly cafés and is great to explore on a rainy day. Use this link for more information on where to park
